

Duo partners need only complete a single Duo Interpretive Joint Script Submission Form.

The student must submit the script in two parts:

- A typewritten script and
- A scanned, photocopied or screenshot of the original source with all added words inserted in the appropriate places.

Typewritten version:

- 1. The typewritten script should be typed exactly as it is going to be presented.
- 2. All added words, not in the original source, must be underlined.

Scanned/Photocopied version:

- 1. Scan/photocopy every original source page which includes words used in the interpretive piece. (*The original source(s) is the book, play, anthology, etc. from which the piece is taken.*)
- 2. Scan/photocopy the title page of the original source(s)
- 3. Scan/photocopy the copyright page with the publication date of the original source(s).
- 4. Highlight all original source words that are used in the script. Do not cross out any words.
- 5. Insert the introduction and any added words in the appropriate spot in the script. (*Joining together disconnected words from the source to create new thoughts or ideas are counted as added words.*)
- 6. Arrange the pages in the order they will be presented.
- 7. Screenshots Students who have secured their literary piece from an internet site must create a computer screenshot of the publication date. In addition, one page should include words from their piece to show the internet source of the piece. The screenshot should include any sidebars, headings, etc., that are a part of the computer screen. *The remaining screenshots only need to contain the portions of the text used.* The screenshots will be compiled in exactly the same way the scanned/photocopied pages are to be compiled. Title and publication information is still required.

Note - The goal is to submit two complete copies. One is typed. The other is scanned/photocopied from the original source with all added words inserted, creating a second complete script. The two scripts will read exactly the same.

If for some reason the competitor is unable to comply with the script submission requirements, or the competitor is missing some required element, a brief explanation should be attached to the Script Submission Form for consideration by tournament administration.

Note regarding reproductions of copyright materials: The <u>Fair Use Doctrine</u> contained in the <u>Copyright Act</u> gives students permission to use or reproduce portions of a copyrighted work if the work is used as part of a student's education. Therefore, the Fair Use Doctrine allows for the reproduction of portions of a copyrighted work for script submissions. However, the Fair Use Doctrine is broader than the Stoa Publication Guidelines. Please be sure your source complies with Stoa Publication Guidelines.

Oratory Analysis (Wildcard) Script Submission Form

Purpose: Oratory Analysis speech scripts should contain the exact text of the student's original speech for the purposes of accountability. Though the speech must be original, it may consist of support from outside sources. The sources of any contributing information must be formally cited so that credit is given where credit is due. The script preparation instructions below will assist with that process.

- 1. The analysis must be an original work, written by the student.
- 2. The student must submit a typewritten copy of their speech.
- 3. All sources must be **cited in text and orally** when presenting.
- 4. All direct quotations <u>must be underlined</u>. This includes the original oration, or portion thereof, that is being quoted.
- 5. No more than 50% of the speech may consist of direct quotations. This includes the original oration, or portion thereof, that is being quoted.
- 6. The original oration's verifiable date (**month**, **day**, **year are required**) and the location of where the oration was delivered must be included in the script.
- 7. A citation page must be created on a separate page at the end of the speech. Any format is acceptable. All sources must be included on the citation page, including the reference for the **published text of the original oration** (book title & author, periodical or url). No audio or video sources will be accepted. *(May use <u>www.easybib.com</u> or other application to assist with the citation page.)*
- 8. A current Script Submission Form must be submitted with the speech script at each tournament.

If for some reason the competitor is unable to comply with the script submission requirements, or if the competitor is missing some required element, a brief explanation should be attached to the Script Submission Form for consideration by tournament administration. No student should be disqualified from tournament competition due to a script formatting error.
